Her scientific research fields focus on international environmental conventions: CITES and CBD; conservation and sustainable use of wild species; taxonomic studies on species of economic interest. She has participated as collaborator in four nationally or internationally funded multi-year work programs, as researcher in nine, as co-director in five, and as director in nine.

From November 1996 to January 2016, she was the European Representative and Chair of the CITES Plants Committee. In this position, held ad Honorem, she has chaired, organized and conducted numerous meetings on five continents.

She has been the author of more than 170 publications including books, book chapters, articles in specialized national and international journals, scientific and technical reports; and has lectured in numerous seminars, courses and conferences on CITES nationally and internationally.

Additionally, she has designed, directed and taught fourteen editions of the Master of the International University of Andalusia, at the Antonio Machado campus, in Spanish, English and French, on "Management and Conservation of Trade Species: The International Framework", linked on four occasions to a doctoral program. Since 1998, a total of 398 people from 106 countries 1998, a total of 398 participants from 106 countries on five continents have participated. The overall purpose of the program is to provide high quality specialized training to enable the implementation and development of the Convention on International Trade in Endangered Species of Wild Fauna and Flora (CITES).
